Thanks to all the members who worked hard to have a successful and fun New Years Eve event. We were able to raised \$200.00 for the Drug Awareness Committee. A special thanks to the people who showed up on New Years Day to clean up – Josh Lehman, Tony Bonanno, Brad March, Skip Walker and Joe McCarthy.

An area we need to improve is our contribution to the Elks National Foundation. Since Larry Thyfault and Gary Michels have been running the Elks Drawings at lodge meetings, we have increased donations for both ENF and Laradon Hall. However, at the recent District Deputy Meeting a comment was made that "Fort Collins has never met their ENF contribution goal". I was not sure this statement was entirely true, so I did some research. I found out that in 1971-1972 the Second Annual Charity Ball for the benefit of the Elks National Foundation raised more than \$5,000.00. Total donations to the National Foundation of \$8,053.00 won the Grand Lodge first place trophy for the largest per member contribution for Lodges over 1,000 members. In 1973-1974 member donations plus receipts of \$3,732 from the fourth Annual Charity Ball resulted in a contribution of \$10,732 to the Elks National Foundation. The lodge again won 1st place in the Grand Lodge contest for Lodges in category IV membership. I know these accomplishments were over 30 years ago, but our lodge has made significant contributions to ENF in the past. Let's work together to increase our ENF contribution in the present. If you have an extra \$1.00 give it to Stan to put toward ENF, if you have an idea on how we can raise additional money for ENF – let me know – and let's just get it done!

## Elks Legacy Project coming in spring!

Legacy – a gift from our predecessors (Webster's Collegiate Dictionary).

Fort Collins Lodge Elks 804 will begin constructing our new front entry with the coming of spring weather. The entry will include our new bronzed Elk standing atop a rock enclosure and welcoming our members and guests to the lodge. Included in the structure will be our flagpole with the addition of the Legacy brick display.

The Legacy brick display will be a visible remembrance of those Elks who preceded us in service to the Order and a link to current members continuing to fulfill their obligation. The Legacy display will also serve the purpose of inviting new members to join us in the honorable work we do in serving our community.

Each Legacy brick will laid out in an array in the Elk and flagpole enclosure and include the etched name of a designated current or past Elk member. The enclosure will be a lighted display with the Elk structure and spreading antlers standing approximately twelve feet above the pavement. Our current request for inclusion of a named member in the display is \$100.00 per brick with all donations designated for 804 Lodge expenses. By becoming an Elks Legacy participant you help in preserving the memory of those who came before while sharing in the continued effort to support our beautiful lodge home.

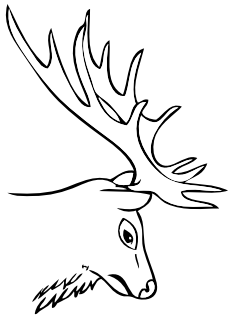

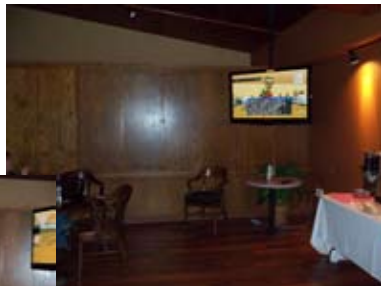
