A donation in the amount of \$17,000.00 was provided to the City of Fort Collins to help with architecture plans for Club Tico. We added over 40 members in 2011-2012, completed the Veteran's Pavilion and our beautiful Elk statue and Legacy Brick Project at the front entrance of the building. We supported youth in our community by providing scholarships, donating money for after prom parties, provided funds to disabled students, supported Team Fort Collins to help educate



our youth on drug awareness, provided sponsorship to a Boy Scout Troop and Youth Baseball teams. We supported the Larimer Food Bank, gave \$1,000 to needy families at Christmas as well as holding a Christmas Party for over 100 children and their families. With your continued support I know the new Exalted Ruler, Joe McCarthy, will continue this momentum during the coming year.

Our Valentine Dance on February 11th was a big success with over 90 people in attendance. The Entertainment Committee worked hard to make this a fun time and it was!

Fort Collins Elks Lodge 804 is continuing to add bricks to our front entry. The entry includes our new bronzed Elk standing atop a rock and welcoming our members and guests to the Lodge. Included in the legacy brick display is our flagpole.

The Legacy brick display is a visible remembrance of those Elks who preceded us in service to the Order and a link to current members continuing to fulfill their obligation. The Legacy display will also serve to invite new members to join us in the honorable work we do in serving our community.

Each Legacy brick is laid in an array in the enclosure and includes the etched name of a designated current or past Elk member. The enclosure will be lighted with the Elk's spreading antlers standing approximately twelve feet above the pavement. The current cost for inclusion of a named member in the display is \$100.00 per brick with all donations designated for Lodge 804 expenses. 

### Good bye and Thanks

As most of you know I'm resigning as Secretary of 804 at the end of March. I do so secure in the knowledge the office of Secretary is being handed over to someone who has provided outstanding leadership for the past two years as your Exalted Ruler – Joyce Bonanno. If the membership will support her the way you have me, the lodge will continue to prosper and grow.

"Keeping Valued Tradition in a Changing Order" is the slogan selected by Joyce Bonanno Exalted Ruler 2010-2012. Valued Tradition implies you do not forget the past for to do so is a risk. Someone has said "it is best when you do not remember the past for you are destined to repeat it." However, past things can carry pleasant memories. Some of you might be saying – "whatever happened Old Timer's Night, Past Exalted Rulers Night and the Saturday night dances? In short all the fun things we did back then. The first part of her slogan may have seemed to be forgotten, but has it or are we in a renewal of tradition which has simple taken on a new form?

Let's examine the "the changing order of Elks." As we all know, "the only thing that does not change is change itself." Let's look at the changes over the last decade or two and examine the traditions and changes. Women were permitted to join our order for the first time in 1995. It was four years later when lodge 804 initiated our first women member, Cheryl Shepherd. Nine years later the first women Exalted Ruler, Joyce Bonanno, was elected. We now have 35 women members. Our first lodge of sorrow for a female member was held for Ann Wasgatt. Ann was a woman truly dedicated to serving others – particularly children. The addition of women to the Elks Lodge was a true historical change, but a beneficial milestone in our history.

Grand Lodge presented some major changes (some thought radical) in our name - subordinate lodge to local, no requirement to memorize the Ritual and consolidation of committees and functions. However, valued traditions were kept in tact (Formal Opening and Closing of the Lodge and the complete Ritual of Initiation.) Much of the paper work was eliminated from a multitude of forms required by Grand Lodge. Many changes took place, but much of the old traditions stayed the same. Grand Lodge and members saw the need to change, yet retain some of the past.

We moved!! I know some of you are saying "Stan you have an amazing grasp of the obvious." It did not come easy, but it came in spite of everything. Frankly I felt it looked like a warehouse when we first opened. This was soon fixed by the addition of our Veteran's Pavilion and picnic area and the Elk Statue in front of the building. Our Legacy Brick Program honoring past and present Elks has added a great deal to the front of the Building. The lodge is beautifully done inside and it's now our home and I'm proud to be a part of it

We now sponsor two youth baseball teams and a Boy Scout Troop. In fact, we had 3 scouts make Eagle Rank in a recent court of Honor at our lodge. When the current Exalted Ruler Joyce took office we were contributing .81 cents to the Elks National Foundation which was the lowest in Colorado and the second lowest in the Western U.S. She made it a priority to attain at least the Grand Lodge Quota of \$4.50 per member. This year, we have nearly doubled our per-capita to \$7.45.

In the past membership languished and continues to be a concern although recent trends show renewed interest in Elkdom. We are now on the rebound and have over 440 members with several individuals waiting to be initiated. We all need to make membership a priority.

### Good bye and Thanks Continued

We continue to support traditional programs such as 804 Scholarship program for PSD Schools, Hoop Shoot, Children's Christmas Parties, After Prom nights, Club Tico and other programs such as Christmas Baskets, Elks Bridge Club and other Senior program for which Fort Collins Elks have long been noted.

One final comment, the other day someone said "the Elks don't do enough for the Veterans (could also have been a comment about your special charity or organization.) I must agree we could do more for the very people whom we owe so much. We recognize them on Veterans Day, but, more important than that, we recognize them at every Lodge meeting. Thanks to Exalted Ruler Joyce who started this "tradition." We can't do everything every member thinks we should, but the things we have done in the past two years we have done the best we can! We have done the best we can because of the support of the members who attend lodge meeting, serve on committees, attend events and sponsor new members.

Someone much wiser than me said," Look not mournfully into the past. It comes not back again. Wisely improve the present for it is yours. Go forth and meet the unknown future without fear."


