
Lastly but certainly not least, our Lodge is participating in the regional Ritual

## THE OLD LODGE LIVES ON AND THE ELKS CONTINUE TO GIVE

The historic YMCA building built in 1907 was acquired by the Elks in 1938 and continued to be Lodge 804's home until 2008, when the building, having fallen into disrepair, was sold to the Downtown Development Authority and the Lodge moved to its newly remodeled building. As part of the sale of the historic Lodge, the committee charged with the sale reached agreements that \$100,000 would be set aside and that the Elks could use the salvage from the building for Lodge-sponsored community projects. Five years later, the Elks' work continues.

Part of the set-aside funds were used to restore and then donate the historic tongue wood piano, which now rests as a beautiful centerpiece at the new Fort Collins Museum. The piano, acquired at the 1938 World's Fair by a group of devoted brothers, was previously in the lobby of the old Lodge for well over half a century and is now lovingly preserved by the Museum and, having been lovingly restored using community contributions raised by the Lodge, is regularly played for recitals. Likewise, the historic hardwood floors which were removed from the Lodge now accent the walls of the new Museum's entryway.

Further funding set aside from the Lodge sale is now being used to fund a significant landscaping project in the area surrounding the City's recently reinvigorated Library Park. Reconfigured walks and beautifully designed landscaping, funded largely by the Elks together with the Friends of the Library, greet the lengthening lines of Library patrons as they check out books and movies and attend community events.

Lodge 804, having always prided itself on providing not only economic but also sweat equity for community projects, provided an aging but hardy crew, which lent time, muscle and patience in meticulously laying out a large sandstone hardscape checkerboard where in years to come locals will be able to concentrate on complicated chess matches with life-size pieces. Adjoining the checkerboard, the Elks (together with volunteering local contractors and equipment) also provided manpower assistance arranging a new amphitheater surrounding what will be the Library's "Children's Storybook Tree".

In addition, on an ongoing basis, the Elks set aside funds for a high-tech project, which will identify the many trees in Fort Collins' oldest and most historic park. Over the last 100 plus years, the history of these trees has been tracked by Fort Collins Arborists; the Library Park tells a fascinating story of Fort Collins horticulture by way of the trees donated by appreciative sister cities and families providing memorials. With the help of local high school students' programs, these trees, dating back over more than a century, will be capable of being identified in the Park via Smartphones, with the history of each planting accessible and preserved for posterity.

Finally, the last remnant of the old Lodge, the ever-present flag pole, which flew our standard for so very many years in front of the old facility, was also salvaged. The pole, with the City's permission, was cut down by two slightly off-kilter brothers in an early morning adventure, is being salvaged, and will be placed in front of the Wellington Library in memory of their recently deceased Librarian. Once again, the pole, which has been unused for the last five years, will fly our Nation's flag in a prominent local public setting.

Lodge 804's current officers thank long-time past and more recent Elks members for their foresight in allowing our local Lodge to continue to give back to the community in so many focal ways. 
