## INFORMATION FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS


Open to the Public versus Members and Their Guests

Being open to the public means anyone can come into the Lodge. In order to be open to the public we have to apply and pay for a special permit. This is due to the type of liquor license we have, because we are an incorporated organization and are not for profit. We have 12 permits per year, they cost \$120.00 per permit and we have to apply for them 4 weeks in advance of the event. We typically like to save these "special permits/open to the public" for large events which outside organizations book to use the Lodge. This is one of the vehicles we use to increase revenue for the Lodge and Club.

When you see information for an event being held at the Lodge for members and guests a member in good standing can invite family and friends to attend the event who are not Elks. However, they must know each other outside of the Lodge and members must be present at all times when the guest is in the Lodge. Most of the events we have are for members and their guests. Under no circumstances are non-Elks permitted to participate in card games.

If you have any questions concerning these policies, please see our Lodge Secretary. She can provide you with information from the Colorado Liquor Division – Licensing and Enforcement and Grand Lodge Statutes which govern these rules and regulations.






#### Let's make the switch to LED

Did you know LED Lights use 85% less energy and last up to 20 years longer than incandescent bulbs?



Ongoing developments in LED lighting and recent reductions in price now make it practical to consider

their use in many common fixtures in our lodge, including accent lighting, track lighting, room lighting and outdoor spotlights. Dimmable LED bulbs are now available as well. While LED lighting may require a higher initial investment, their longevity, low maintenance and significant cost savings make LED bulbs a purchase that can pay for itself over time.

Brother Kevin Nelson recently suggested a plan to start replacing the lights in the lodge with LED bulbs. His idea is to have members "Adopt a Light". Members would purchase a bulb to replace an existing bulb in the lodge. Current prices range from approximately \$8 - \$30 each, depending on the type of bulb.

Also, Lecturing Knight, Larry King is looking into energy grants and rebates which are currently being offered by Fort Collins Utilities. Grants up to \$5000 per customer are available for eligible efficiency improvement projects which includes lighting. This grant would be a great way for us to get started with a bulb replacement program for our lodge.

Watch the bulletin boards in the Lodge and the Echo in the coming months for additional information regarding the "Adopt a Light" program and the FC Utilities grants.


