

From Leading Knight Mike Sutton

With election of officers in February, I feel this is an appropriate time to provide information on "what it takes/means to be an officer of the Lodge".

How are officers selected and how much time does it take to be an officer? These are two of the most frequently asked question from members. To answer this, there are two methods of choosing an officer. First is to self-select by making it known to the Exalted Ruler you are interested. Second is by observation from other members and officers. Both of these methods assume you have sufficient back ground in the Order of Elks and it history especially if you are interested in becoming a Trustee or Chair Officer.

Each officer has well defined committees and responsibilities. Being an officer does not mean you are simply seen twice a month during Lodge Meetings. An officer's time commitment at the Elks can affect family, church, job and recreation. A spouse or significant other must be fully supportive of your commitment to the Elks. Most officers are not paid with the exception of the Secretary and Treasurer who have daily hours and expectations of certain duties. Most officers will have "out of pocket" travel and food expenses. The exception to this is the Lodge is required to pay for the Exalted Ruler to attend the Elks National Convention which is held yearly in a large city in the United States. 6832

Officers are required to learn when and how to apply Rules, Regulations and By-laws of their local Lodge. They must have a working knowledge of the political structure of the Elks, State and National, as well as being familiar with "Elks Protocol". An excellent way to obtain this information is by attending an Elks Leadership Seminar. The next one is scheduled for March 6-8th in Fort Collins.

"An officer must have Predictability, Punctuality and Dependability". These three words describe exactly what is expected of an officer in the Order of Elks. The motives for being an Elk or Officer of the Lodge are personal and you are always welcome to volunteer in any capacity. Each member must decide on the contribution they will make.

During the past year I have appreciated the support and encouragement I have received from our current officers as well as the Lodge Membership. Fraternally,

Secretary Notes

February 2015

The new Lodge Year will start on April 1st and membership due notices will be sent out the first week of February. The new cards for the 2015-2016 Lodge Year will be yellow and the card readers will be changed on April 1, 2015. You must have a new membership card by Tuesday, April 1, 2015 for entry into the Lodge. The membership dues are .50 cents less than last year. Regular membership is \$168.00 and Life Membership is \$93.00. Associate Membership remains the same at \$50.00, and a spouse card is \$5.00. If you cannot pay your dues in full, we do accept half payments for regular and life membership. If you are a regular member half of your dues are \$93.00 by April 1st with remainder of \$75.00 payable on October 1, 2015. If you are a life member, half of your dues are \$56.00 by April 1st and the remainder of \$37.00 due on October 1, 2015.

On March 6-8th The Leadership Development Seminar will be held at the Fort Collins Lodge. This is an excellent seminar which provides information on Business Practices, Financial Planning, and information on Protocol, Lodge Risk Management as well as other subjects specifically related to the Order of Elks. The cost of the Seminar is only \$20.00 per person and I strongly suggest if you are thinking about becoming an Officer or just want to learn more about the Elks this is a seminar you should attend. It will also give you the opportunity to meet and interact with other Elk Members from Colorado. If you are interested in attending make your \$20.00 check out to Colorado Elks Association, Inc. and have it to me by Friday, February 13th. I have attended four of these seminars and at each one I've learned something important and interesting about our Order.

CHECK CASHING POLICY CHANGE EFFECTIVE MARCH 1, 2015


