

Brothers and Sisters-

Yesterday I watched a video on YouTube that showcased members of our Order telling why they joined the Elks. It was interesting how many people I recognized from my time in Indianapolis for the Grand Lodge Session this past July. After I watched the video it caused me to sit back and think about why I joined.

I seems like I have had some type of attachment to the Elks as long as I can remember. As a young boy in Lancaster, New York I remember walking to the Elks Lodge from my grandparent's house to bowl. Later in life bowling became a big part of my life. I never had a lesson, just sort of self taught at the Elks. My high school years found me in Rochester, New York and provided me with a couple of opportunities to attend functions at their Lodge. I remember being intrigued by the history of the Lodge which was proudly displayed on the walls throughout the building. When Kodak brought me to Fort Collins in 1976, one of the first people I met



was the Exalted Ruler of the Fort Collins Lodge, Fred Frantz. My mom and dad moved into Fred's neighborhood, as did many other of the 'Kodak' transplants. The neighborhood became tight pretty quickly. The bond was obviously New York and Kodak, but between the men I heard a lot of talk about the Elks. Being 18 at the time I was too young to join, but I was interested.

When the lodge was reopened after the explosion of 1977, I was asked by my sponsor, member Ed Morphett, to join the Elks. So, at 22 years old, in February 1979, I was initiated with my class of 91 new members. Why did I join? There were many reasons, a private bar, hand/racquetball courts, a state of the art weight room, gambling and all sorts of cool 'guy stuff'. It wasn't enough, 5 years later I let my membership lapse. As the years passed I visited my old lodge many times for receptions and parties. In fact, Tammy and I held our wedding reception in the old building in December of 1995. Each visit left me considering rejoining but I kept putting it on the back burner. Then one day in 2006, as I was taking a shower, a feeling 'washed' over me. I found Tammy and told her that I had to rejoin the Elks. She asked me why? I told her that I was supposed to do something for them, although I didn't have any idea what that might be.

In the nearly 10 years that have passed I still haven't figured out what is I am supposed to do. Whatever it is, I don't believe I have done it yet, maybe I'll ever know. So, I guess I still can't tell you why I joined the Elks the second time, I do however know why I am still a member and why I always will be. It's because we matter. We touch people's lives, maybe just a little bit at a time, but we make a difference! At the end of the day, after all the meetings, after all the events, after all the dinners and games of bingo, after all the fun and the day to day struggles, we matter!

#### Secretary Notes Echo October 2015

Thanks to our members who volunteer at our events, attend Lodge Meetings and support our Club. The average cost to run the Lodge/Club (payroll, utilities, insurance, maintenance, phones, food and liquor purchases, office supplies and a number of other items) is approximately \$21,000.00 per month. Our membership dues average roughly \$48,000.00 per year. This is just enough to cover expenses for about two months. As you can see, it is critically important for our members to support the Lodge through volunteering and support of our restaurant and bar. If you have a special occasion — celebrate it at the Lodge. If you have friends or family who are having an event, suggest they use the Elks Lodge. Of course this is not free, but we can provide a competitive price compared to other venues in the Fort Collins area. These events are how we can continue to make our Lodge profitable.

The Board of Directors has taken action to control expenses . Often times these decisions are not popular, but have to be made. We are not immune to prices increases for food and liquor and utilities. We have an investment account, but we cannot continue to take money out of this account to pay our bills. The Board is looking at ways to use the Lodge property to increase revenue. However, any item which has an expense of over \$25,000.00 needs Grand Lodge Approval. Grand Lodge reviews our Auditing and Accounting report from the past several years and they will be reluctant to give approval of any type of expenditure if we are not showing we can support Lodge expenses without using money out of our reserves. We are fortunate we own our Lodge and have three very healthy charitable accounts to support our charitable giving. Hugh Shepherd has worked hard the past two years to boost our bingo account by making sure the Lodge has the opportunity to participate in the legal purchase of pickles.

Membership is important to our Lodge as well. Without members we will not exist. We will be holding an open house at the Lodge on Thursday, November 5th. The objective of this event is to show case our Lodge and all we do for our community. Invite your family, friends , co-workers and neighbors to visit us and find out what we do. Additional information on this event will be sent out on e-mail, through our Website and our Facebook account as well as advertising around the Fort Collins area in the few weeks.
