



Keep Using Those Grocery Gift Cards

Who would have thought that just through regular grocery shopping our members would earn \$451.97 for our Lodge charities? Last week we received our first rebate from King Soopers Neighborhood Rewards program. Jointly, we hit the \$5000 mark in purchases which brought us our first check. Here are a few tips to help make the check-out process easy:

- Know how much remains on your card by writing down the remaining amount printed on your receipt from your last shopping trip and keeping it in your wallet.
- If you need to add money, have your cash, check, or debit card ready to give the cashier along

with your gift card before she/he begins processing your order.

- If your monthly shopping costs are pretty consistent, consider loading that amount at the beginning of the month. That eliminates having to reload your card each time you shop.
- Pay with the gift card after you have swiped your regular store rewards card.
- Save your receipt so you can write down your new gift card balance.

Remember, just about all of your purchases qualify for the 5% rebate including gasoline and prescriptions. So load and use those cards to benefit a great cause – Lodge #804's charitable work.
