

Our Board, comprised of your elected members, is charged with the preservation of our Lodge Home. Several proposals will be forwarded for member input and approval with the goal of keeping our Lodge Home solvent for many years to come. Please keep tuned in and participate in these efforts.

### From The Station of the Loyal Knight

In December, we were fortunate to again host the Children's Shopping Spree for 30 children in our community who are in need. These children needed basic items such as coats, socks, shoes, gloves, shirts, pants, etc. Our Lodge members were a huge part of this activity! What you probably know or saw is that we had more than 30 lodge members volunteer to chaperone a child at Kohl's. Our chaperones made sure the child was getting items they needed, using all of the \$100 provided to each child by our Lodge and the Beacon Grant from ENF.

ENF? Elks National Foundation. What is ENF and why did they give us money? This may be the part you didn't 'see' or realize! Each year, the Grand Exalted Ruler asks us to donate a certain amount to ENF per member. That amount currently is \$4.65/member. Once we reach that amount, we are able to apply for grants from ENF that will allow us to give more back to our community! The sooner we reach this goal, the sooner we can start applying for such grants that help our Lodge and our community!

Why am I bringing up a Christmas activity in March? Because April is coming quickly and with that is our new fiscal year, which means we must start over at donating to ENF. Come April 1st, we will be a \$0.00 of the \$4.65/member of our goal (which our lodge greatly exceeds every year). How can you help? Here's a couple of ideas! Add a few dollars to your yearly dues check and allocate them to ENF, play the raffle on Lodge Night, or come up with your own fundraiser to help us reach our goal quickly! Once we reach that \$4.65/member, we are on our way to great things! Last year we brought \$6,000.00 (which is more than triple our required donation) to our Lodge from ENF through just 3 grants! 
