## From The Station of the Lecturing Knight

Dear Brother and Sister Elks,

On November 11th, we will observe Veterans Day originally known as Armistice Day, which marked the unofficial end of World War I (WWI). The official end of WWI is June 28, 1919. However, a temporary end of hostility between the Allied nations and Germany was enacted on the eleventh hour, on the eleventh day of the eleventh month.

Veterans Day is a day for solemn reflection to honor those who died in the service of our military, to honor the men and women who served our country, and to give thanks for the things of which we are free and the opportunities our freedom affords us. These days, it seems we often dismiss the price that was paid to ensure our freedoms and, thus, we take our freedom for granted.

I did not serve in the military but I did serve as a first responder for many years. I acknowledge that my service is marginal compared to those who served in our military services. I don't mention this to tout my service, but rather to note that my experience may help me better understand what it might mean to be a service person.

What does the price of freedom look like? It has the face of young men and women, often fresh out of high school, boldly, abruptly and willingly stepping into adulthood. It is leaving family and loved ones behind to travel and live in harsh and hostile environments. It is missing birthdays, and Christmases. It is forming strong bonds of brotherly love, knowing that they may not last. It is putting complete trust in others. It is experiencing events that very few people have experienced or can ever understand. Finally and solemnly, it is the ultimate sacrifice of life.

For those who are veterans, I thank you. For those of us who are not, I bid that we always keep before us the understanding of the price that was paid for our freedom so that we may never take it for granted.
