#### From The Station of the Loyal Knight

Greetings members and families,

I hope everyone has been able to enjoy their favorite winter activities this year and beginning to look forward to Spring.

With Spring approaching, it also means another school year will be ending. If anyone has any family or friends with high school juniors who have aspirations of attending college when they graduate next year, now would be a great time to tell them about the Elks Scholarship programs. This is another reason the Elks is the greatest organization in the USA. Outside of our Federal Government, the Elks provide more scholarships, both scholastic and vocational, to our nation's high school seniors than any other organization in the US.

On the national level, the Elks National Foundation typically awards 500 Most Valuable Student scholarships. The Most Valuable Student scholarship contest is open to any high school senior who is a U.S. citizen. Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need. The top 20 finalists will participate in an all-expense paid Leadership Weekend in Chicago where they will be interviewed by the Elks judges. These 20 finalists will be vying for two first-place awards of \$50,000; two second-place awards of \$40,000; and two third-place awards of \$30,000. The remaining 14 finalists will receive awards of \$20,000. The 480 runners-up will receive fifth-place scholarships of \$4,000. The top two winners will be invited to our National Convention and will address the attendees on the final day.

In Fort Collins, we also provide several scholarships to our local seniors and that presentation will be coming up in a couple months. Please keep your eye out for more details in September 2018 as to upcoming deadlines. It is a very rewarding experience.

Greetings Sister and Brother Elks,

As some of my articles have indicated, I have taken the opportunity to muse on my explorations of the virtues on which our Order is founded. This month, all be it ironic that I write this article past its due date. I am exploring the virtue of Fidelity.



#### **Secretary Notes - February 2018**

With our 2017-2018 Lodge year almost over and our new Lodge year 2018-2019 starting on April 1st, you will be receiving your dues statements by mid-February. Because of several large insurance claims, the insurance companies are increasing our premium for the 2018-2019 year. The total of our Grand Lodge Per-Capita will be \$17. Our State Per-Capita will remain at \$2.50. Under Section 4.231, 14.150 and 14.300, Law of the Order, it is mandatory for the collection of the Per Capita from each member including life members. Our per-capita payment is due to Grand Lodge and the State Association by May 1, 2018 and will be approximately \$7,900. This is one of the reasons it is critical for members to pay their dues by March 31, 2018. If you are on our membership roster and you have not paid your dues, the Lodge is still required to pay your Per-Capita. This is a request for members to pay their dues as early as possible to allow the Lodge to have the funds to meet our Per-Capita payments. We can accept cash, checks and credit cards.

Regular Member dues are \$169.50. If you cannot pay the full amount, we will accept half payment, but you must include the Per-Capita payment in your first installment which will be \$94.50. The second half dues must be paid by October 1, 2018 and the amount will be \$75. You will receive a statement in the mail in September as a reminder about your October dues payment.

Life dues are \$94.50. If you cannot pay the full amount, we will accept half payment, but you must pay the Per-Capita payment in your first installment which makes that amount \$56.75. The second half dues must be paid by October 1, 2018 and the amount will be \$37.75. You will receive a statement in the mail in September as a reminder about your October dues payment.

The 2018-2019 Membership Cards are a light tan in color. The door locks will be changed early in the day on April 1, 2018. If you do not have a 2018-2019 Membership card, you will not be able to come into the Lodge until your dues are paid based on Section 14.220 Annotated Statutes.

As a reminder, if you bring a visitor to the Lodge more than eight times in a three month period, you should encourage them to join since they obviously like coming to the Lodge. As members, they could help us in our charitable activities. By joining the Lodge they can also attend Lodge meetings and participate in our drawings and events. And, in addition, they would meet our incredible membership and would certainly make new valuable friends in the process.


