Greetings Brothers and Sisters of Elks Lodge 804,

As I write this article for the March Echo, my last as the 2017 – 2018 ER, I am able to reflect back on what a fantastic year we have had at Lodge 804.

We started off last April with a donation and Elks participation in the Foothills Gateway Flying Pig 5K run for the benefit of developmentally delayed children. Through the spring and summer months, we celebrated Mother's Day, 804 actively supported youth sports programs, Boy Scout Troop 87, the Elks Americanism Essay Contest, a Car Show, and donated to area high school prom parties. During the fall season, the Elks Special Needs program donated to Disabled Resource Services and we were represented at its Wine Fest. We also contributed to the Larimer County Food Bank. The holiday season brought on a flurry of activities including the Realities for Children shopping spree, Christmas Basket donations to needy families, the Elks Children's Christmas Party, the Members Christmas Party, and a New Years Eve dinner and dance. Since the holidays, Lodge 804 has participated in a Veterans Stand Down and provided Veteran's Start-up Kits for independent living. We also partnered with New Belgium Brewery and provided packages, letters and cards to active duty troops. We are now in the process of reviewing scholarship applications for graduating seniors. Most recently, we raised nearly \$16,000.00 during our "Friendship Night" fundraiser with the Loveland and Greeley lodges to benefit the K-99 Radio 28 Hours of Hope project for abused and neglected children.

Lodge 804 officers and the PER group have also provided numerous activities for the membership. We had a Laughlin Resort raffle, took a trip to Deadwood, attended a Rockies game, had a Kentucky Derby party, and enjoyed a special Valentines Day dinner prepared and served by our outstanding staff. Lodge 804 has also been cited at CEA meetings for exceeding per capita contributions to ENF, donations to Laradon Hall and the new Elks Youth Camp. We noted the loss of beloved members at our Memorial service, but have added a significant number of new members this past year. Our Flag Day event continues to be one of the special things we do at Lodge 804.

In closing, it has been an honor to serve the membership of this Lodge. Thanks to those who attend Lodge meetings for that is where the strength of any lodge resides.

From The Station of the Lecturing Knight

Greetings Brother and Sister Elks,

As February, 2018 marked the 150th anniversary of the Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks, I would like to provide a brief history of the Order. It was started by a group of actors and musicians in the New York City area. Original meetings, held primarily on Sundays, were informal, consisting of performances, eating, and drinking, and were when the New York City bars were closed. The group was originally known as the Jolly Corks. The name is derived from a trick played on an unknowing bar patron by two members, which resulted in the bar patron losing the bet and purchasing drinks for the witty Corks.

Soon after formation, members were granted status as a private club, allowing members to meet on Sundays when bars were closed. The group was composed of immigrants from various nations and the general feeling was that it should be uniquely American and its symbol should be as such, thus the Elk was adopted.

Although established as private club, charity has always been a part of our Order. It is said that when a performer lost work, the other members collected money and food for his family. This practice evolved as did the formality and rituals of the order, much of which we still see today.

The Elks always played a major role in assisting veterans. During the 1917 Grand Lodge, it was declared that "the Elk give first consideration to the sick and wounded on the battlefields." Shortly after the decree, the Elks financial contributions helped establish the first two base hospitals in France. In 1918, the Elk build a 700 bed hospital given to the federal government to assist injured veterans. Additionally, rehabilitation, vocational and education loans were given to returning vets. This served as a model for the GI bill.

The honoring of our Nation's flag is deeply rooted in our Order. In 1907, Grand Lodge designated June 14th as Flag Day. In 1911, a resolution was adopted requiring every lodge to observe the occasion. Finally, through the Elks' prompting, Woodrow Wilson officially proclaimed June 14th as the official Flag Day. As we mark our 150th anniversary, be proud of the all we have done both nationally and locally and what we will do well into the future.

Process for Suggestions

Most every member has ideas on how our Lodge should be run, what kind of food should be served and how much they should be charged as well as many other issues too numerous to mention. Every member, at one time or another, may have felt they could run a better meeting, convey more important information or even feel they could make better decisions and run the Lodge more effectively. That's certainly human nature in a community setting.

New ideas are good for the Lodge and there's nothing wrong with questioning why a decision was made. However, when the delivery is inappropriate, it can be hurtful to those who work so hard to make our Lodge successful. There are appropriate and effective ways to voice opinions, suggestions and concerns. The Lodge Board of Directors meets the second Tuesday of every month at 5:30 p.m. Any member with questions or ideas on any business of the Lodge is welcome to attend the meeting. Let the Lodge Secretary know you'll be attending the meeting to discuss a specific subject and you'll be allotted time at the meeting. Any member in good standing has the ability to question decisions and has a direct line to the Board and/or Officers. Every member also has the opportunity to run for a position on the Board. Our bar staff does not have the authority to resolve issues or make changes in the Lodge so that is not an appropriate venue in which to voice concerns.

It is also discourteous during a Lodge meeting for members in the audience to mutter criticism or talk to those around them negatively about how the meeting is being run or how or what messages are being conveyed. Comments muttered carry across the room and it is disruptive. Anyone who has something to say in a Lodge meeting can certainly speak up and share those thoughts with all of the other members in attendance. That's how we, as adults, communicate effectively and remove ourselves from what becomes harmful backbiting.

Our Officers give hours of their time to serve our Lodge and many of them may be at the Lodge seven days a week. They attend Quarterly Meetings, District Deputy Meetings, practice the ritual, attend not only Lodge meetings, but Board Meetings, Entertainment meetings and budget meetings. They help with repairs and cleanup around the Lodge, plan and attend events and can usually be found at the Lodge during the week and on Friday nights.

By following the established processes for registering concerns and suggestions, it also reinforces the principles of our Order – Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity.

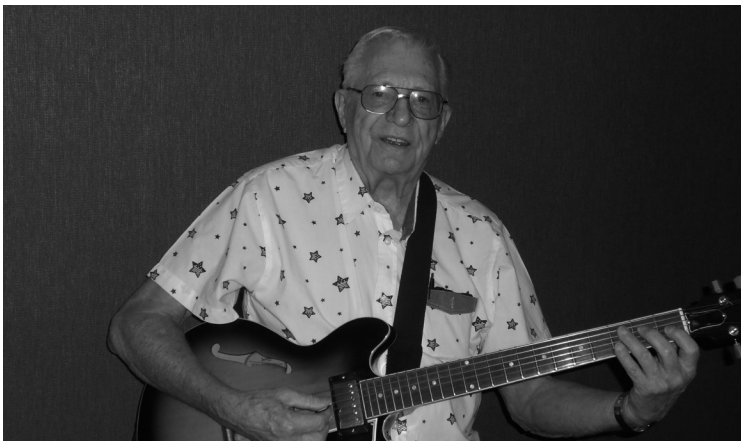
