What is Laradon? Laradon is a private, non-profit organization that was founded in 1948 as Colorado's first alternative school for children with developmental disabilities. Laradon has grown to become one of the most comprehensive educational, vocational, residential and therapeutic programs in the country for children and adults with developmental disabilities.

What is the Mission and Vision of Laradon? Laradon's mission is to be an organization of excellence that provides superior services to children and adults with developmental disabilities and other special needs to help them realize their full potential and maximize self-sufficiency. Laradon provides the training, education, services and support to children and adults with special needs to live and work in the community as productive, valued members.

How Can I Help Laradon? You can help by contributing to Laradon's fundraising campaigns, such as our annual Red Stocking campaign; donating new supplies and equipment; remembering Laradon in your Will. You can also give us the names and addresses of individuals who you think would be interested in donating to Laradon and conducting fundraisers in your community. You can also hire Laradon participants for jobs in your place of employment.

Who Does Laradon Serve? Laradon serves infants through senior citizens. We offer an infant and toddler program for children who have disabilities or are at risk for delays; a school for children and adolescents; a basic skills program for those with more severe disabilities; an employment program for adults; a senior's program; a program for the medically fragile and a host home program. The children and adults have various levels of disabilities and some have co-existing physical or psychiatric disorders.

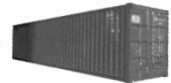




Finally, don't forget to vote! Once again, the Lodge is an official polling place: how easy is that!
